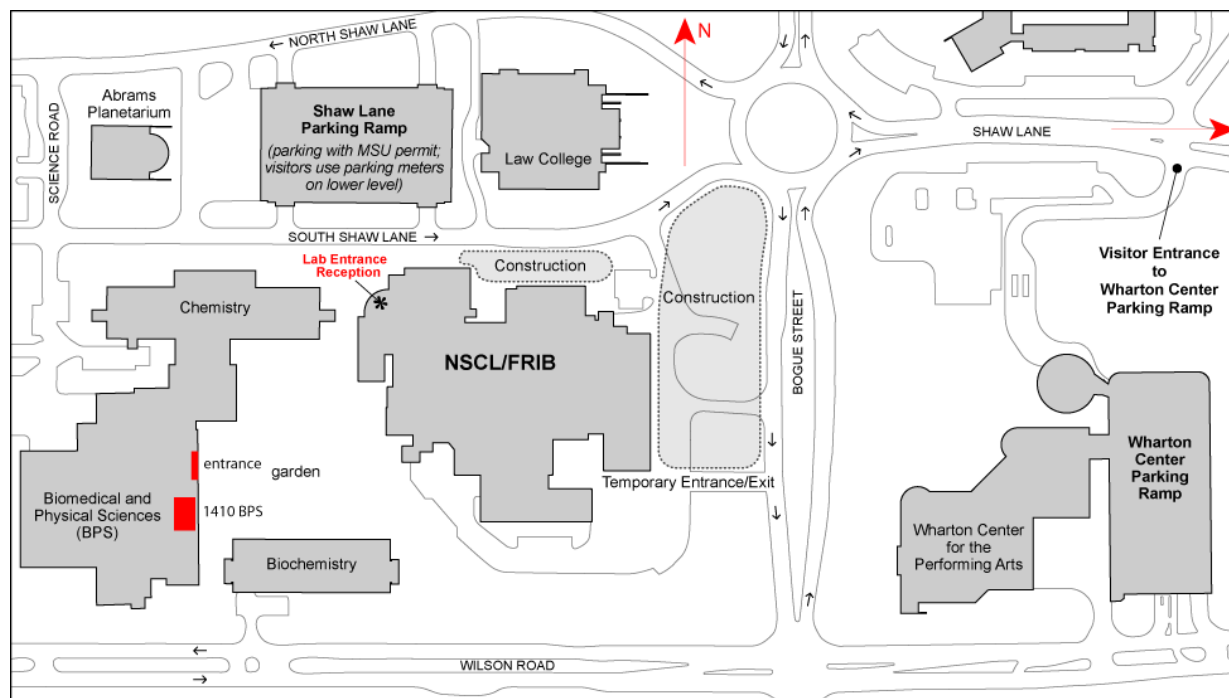


New Parking Guidelines for NSCL Users November 21, 2011



The back portion of the NSCL parking lot is now permanently closed. The new parking options for NSCL users are as follows.

1. The front portion of the NSCL parking lot, accessible from South Shaw Lane as you drive east, continues to be available. It has 4 visitor spots. After parking, please walk to the west end of the building to the main lobby (marked "Lab Entrance" in the map above), get a Cyclotron Parking Permit from the receptionist, and hang the permit in your vehicle.
2. If there is no vacant visitor spot in the front portion of the NSCL parking, continue driving on South Shaw Lane to the "Visitor Entrance to Wharton Center Parking Ramp," collect a ticket from the ticket dispenser when you enter the ramp, park your vehicle, walk back to the NSCL main lobby, and collect one of the two parking permits described below from Raman Anantaraman.
 - If your visit is for 24 hours or less, please purchase a 24-hour Visitor permit from Raman, at a cost of \$6. At some convenient time during the day, hang the permit from the rearview mirror of your vehicle so that the time, date, and permit number are visible from the outside of the vehicle. Present the permit along with the ticket from the dispenser to the booth attendant (if present) upon exiting the ramp. Visitor permits are not valid at meters, not in leased spaces, not in University vehicle spaces, not in Service vehicle spaces, and not in disabled spaces.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Overnight parking, between the hours of 2 AM and 6 AM, is not allowed in the Wharton ramp. So, please move your vehicle to the Shaw ramp and park in any of the employee spaces there before 2 AM. (Both the 24-hour permits and the one-week conference permits are valid in the employee spaces of the Shaw ramp as well as on the visitor side of the Wharton ramp.)

- For visits of up to 7 days, please purchase a one-week conference permit from Raman, at a cost of \$10.25. At some convenient time during the first day, affix the permit to the inside of your front windshield on the lower driver's side so that the dates and privileges are facing outside of the vehicle. The Permit is void if altered/changed/corrected, duplicated, and/or transferred. The rest of the rules and procedures are the same as for the 24-hour permit. In particular, as noted under "Important Note" above, please move your vehicle to an employee space in the Shaw ramp before 2 AM on your first night.

Other notes:

- Parking at Shaw Ramp: As noted above, the 24-hour permits and one-week conference permits are valid on the visitor side of the Wharton ramp and also in the employee spaces of the Shaw ramp. However, parking in the Shaw ramp without a permit upon first arrival is illegal. If we can conveniently get the permit to you before your first arrival on campus (e.g. by delivery to your hotel), you can legally park in the Shaw ramp starting from Day 1. Please contact Raman at raman@nscl.msu.edu to discuss possibilities.
- Visits of a few hours: There are other options for short-term visits of a few hours: two-hour visitor permits at \$1.50 each, four-hour visitor permits at \$3.00 each, and validated stamps for parking in the Wharton ramp at \$0.40 for each half-hour. Please contact Raman if you are interested in these options.
- Arrival after work hours or on weekend: Parking in the employee spaces of Shaw ramp is free between 6 PM and 7 AM on weekdays and all weekend (for exception on home football days, please see next note). No permit is required during those times. Parking in the front portion of the NSCL parking lot requires a (free) Cyclotron Parking Permit at all times. Please contact Raman as needed.
- Special rules for home football days: You may not park in any location in the Shaw ramp overnight (2 AM to 6 AM) the night before a home football game. You should park in one of the visitor parking spots in the front portion of the NSCL parking lot, with a Cyclotron Parking Permit displayed. Luckily for NSCL visitors, this year's home football season is over and next year's season is about nine months away.
